### THE CONTRIBUTORS

EVAN LUARD was formerly a member of the British Foreign Service and is at present a Supernumerary Fellow of St. Antony's College, Oxford, and a Member of Parliament for Oxford. A second edition of his book *Peace and Opinion: A Study of the Modern International System* will be published this year.

C. S. WHITAKER, JR., is Assistant Professor of Political Science and Associate Dean, Graduate Division, University of California, Los Angeles. He is coauthor of "The Federal Republic of Nigeria" in *National Unity and Regionalism in Eight African States* (1966), edited by Gwendolen M. Carter. He is completing a book on Northern Nigeria and is also editing a collection of original essays and published sources on the theme of political continuity in developing areas.

Soon Sung Cho is Visiting Associate Professor of Political Science at the Far Eastern and Russian Institute, University of Washington. He previously taught at Korea University, International Christian University in Tokyo, and the University of Nebraska. He is the author of Korea in World Politics (1966) and is working on another book, Korea: The Politics of a Divided Nation.

ROBERT C. TUCKER, Professor of Politics and Director of the Program in Russian Studies at Princeton, is a Faculty Associate of the Center of International Studies. His publications include *The Soviet Political Mind* (1963) and, with his coeditor Stephen Cohen, *The Great Purge Trial* (1965). He was a Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences in 1964-1965 and is at work on a study of Stalin.

JOHN T. McALISTER, JR., a recent Ph.D. from Yale, is a Research Associate of the Center of International Studies, Princeton University. From 1959 to 1961, while on active duty as a reserve officer in the United States Navy, he was adviser to the Vietnamese Navy River Force in the Mckong Delta. He has contributed to Southeast Asian Tribes, Minorities, and Nations (1967) and is completing a book, based on research in the French army's archives of the Indochina War, to be entitled Viet Nam: The Origins of Revolution.

DAVIS B. BOBROW is Senior Social Scientist in the Director's Division of the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. His major research interests are in defense policy and national communication. He edited and contributed to Components of Defense Policy (1965) and is coeditor and coauthor of Computers and International Relations (forthcoming). As for Chinese matters, he is engaged in a pilot content analysis of People's Daily materials for the years 1960-1964.

J. ALLEN SMITH is Professor of Law at Rutgers: The State University, New Jersey. He contributes to legal journals, writing primarily in the field of inheritance.
