Japanese, English and Continental sources, which are available to the student—designs suitable for leather-work, metal-work, batik, block-printing, pottery and stencilling.

A second article by M. B. Galt and M. K. Rauch deals with similar "finds" in collections of weaving and textiles in Washington, D.C.
