# TERRORISM AND HOSTAGES IN INTERNATIONAL LAW

## – A COMMENTARY ON THE HOSTAGES CONVENTION 1979

**Joseph J. Lambert**

This book provides an in-depth commentary on the Hostages Convention and, to a lesser extent, the seven other agreements dealing with offences related to terrorism.

The first part examines the general background to the Hostages Convention, the growth in the phenomenon of international terrorism and the various efforts of the world community to deal with it.

The second and largest part of the book is an entirely new and comprehensive article-by-article commentary on the Hostages Convention itself. Drawing principally upon the preparatory work of this Convention and the other anti-terrorism conventions, the author analyzes in detail each provision of the Convention as well as its efficacy as a whole in the fight against terrorism.

Among the legal issues examined in relation to international terrorism are extradition, asylum, mutual assistance in criminal matters, State responsibility, international efforts to prevent terrorism, the establishment of extra-territorial jurisdiction, the principle of *non-refoulement*, the relationship between terrorism and the laws of armed conflict, and the use of force in response to terrorism.

Dr Lambert is a member of the New York and Massachusetts bars. After graduating from law school in the United States, the author specialized in international law at Cambridge University where he obtained the LL.M. and Ph.D. degrees. He was a Research Scholar of the University of Cambridge Research Centre for International Law, 1985–1988. Dr Lambert is now associated with the New York law firm of Dewey, Ballantine, Bushby, Palmer & Wood.

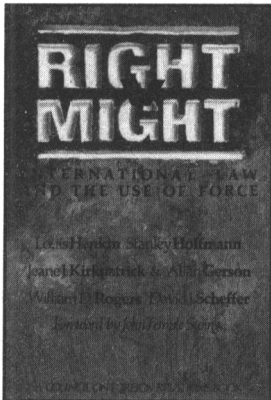
