ALETHEIA

An International Journal of Philosophy

A new international journal-yearbook, *Aletheia*, is scheduled for publication in February, 1977. The journal is to be a forum for the discussion of such classic philosophical themes as the nature and kinds of knowledge, the nature of substance, causality, value, persons, existence, God, and the foundations of morality, art, community, and religion. The orientation of the journal is a phenomenological realism initiated by such thinkers as the early Husserl, M. Scheler, R. Ingarden, A. Reinach, A. Pfander, and D. von Hildebrand. The object of this orientation is to know Being and Truth as they are in themselves. Thus it attempts to overcome relativizing Being and Truth to individual minds, economic or historic process, to language, or to transcendental consciousness. In order to promote discussion of this approach, the journal will include translations of the German authors listed above, and it will invite objections or criticisms for possible publication.
