LIBRARIES AND ARCHIVES

Bibliographies on Aboriginal Anthropology Prepared—Bibliographies for the seven Central American countries of Panama, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala, British Honduras, and Costa Rica have been prepared in the

field of aboriginal anthropology (see LARR II:1, p. 174 for listings of two of the publications). Authors of the bibliographies, which vary from 80 to over 300 pages, are Edwin M. Shook, Jorge A. Lines, and Michael D. Olien. A list of titles and prices may be obtained from the Central American Field Program, Tropical Science Center, Associated Colleges of the Midwest, Apartado 2732, San José, Costa Rica.

CIDOC Library Details Materials—The three-volume 1967 Acquisition Catalog of the Library of the Centro Intercultural de Documentación (CIDOC) describes the growing amount of catalogued and classified materials on religion, symbols, and value-oriented institutions in Latin America since 1850, now available at CIDOC.

Another activity of the CIDOC library is in connection with a series of publications, the *CUADERNOS*, which comprises manuscripts or out-of-print books having a limited public but important relevance to Latin American studies. This series was begun in 1966 to reproduce materials on religious and ideological controversies in Latin America; it is complementary to the CIDOC *SONDEOS* series (see LARR III:1, pp. 156–157) and the CIDOC *DOSSIER* series described on pp. 146–147. *CUADERNOS* published include: *Center of Intercultural Formation: First Five Years* by Esperanza Godot, and *Catálogo de Adquisiciones*, with separate issues on items corresponding to religious, social science, and bibliographic sources (*CUADERNOS* 2–5).

Cornell University Purchases Collection on Argentine Politics—A significant acquisition of the Cornell University library was the purchase of some 300 books and pamphlets on Argentine socialism, published in Buenos Aires and Montevideo between 1910 and the mid-1940's. Bought as a single collection, the books include writings of such political figures as Alfredo Palacios, Rómulo Bogliolo, Américo Ghioldi, Juan B. Justo, Nicolás Repetto, Carlos Sánchez Viamonte, and Juan Antonio Solari. Several rare and unusual pamphlets published by the Partido Socialista shortly before the Perón era are also contained.

Proverb Collection Housed at University of Florida—The University of Florida library houses an unpublished collection of over 65,000 Spanish and Latin American proverbs, which were collected under the direction of Francis C. Hayes, professor of foreign languages at the university. Begun in 1934 at the University of North Carolina by Dr. Hayes, the collection was removed to the University of Florida in 1947 and is at present a joint project of both schools. A dictionary which dates back to fourteenth century Spain forms the nucleus of the collection, along with entries drawn from Spanish language literature, other printed collections, the speech of Spanish-speaking informants,

and a contribution of 200 or more Mexican proverbs. At present, plans are being formulated to publish the collection in dictionary form.

Library Catalogues Made Available—Research aids in the fields of philosophy and psychology, religion, social sciences, science and technology, the arts, literature, and history are listed periodically by G. K. Hall and Company as available for purchase by libraries or interested organizations. In the November 1967 *List of Reference Works*, Latin American content catalogues and their home institutions which are willing to sell them included: Catalog of the Latin American Collection, University of Texas Library; Index to Latin American Periodicals, Columbus Memorial Library, Pan American Union; Index to Latin American Periodical Literature (1929–1960 and, separately, 1961–1965), Columbus Memorial Library; Author and Subject Catalogues of the Canning House Library (Hispanic Catalogues and Luso-Brazilian Catalogues purchased separately), Hispanic Council-Luso-Brazilian Council, London; Catalogue of the Library of the Hispanic Society of America, New York; and the Dictionary Catalog of the History of the Americas Collection, New York Public Library. Also available is the Index to Latin American Legislation, 1950–1960, from the Library of Congress. Prices and new listings may be requested from G. K. LSU Acquires Latin American Materials—In January 1968, the Latin American Studies Institute of Louisiana State University acquired the *Biblioteca sobre Integración Económica*, a joint gift from the Centro de Estudios Monetarios Latinoamericanos, Mexico City, and the Inter-American Development Bank. This collection of monographs, whose authors include prominent Latin American and U. S. scholars and financial specialists, is of particular value to the student interested in Latin American economic integration and financial problems. The collection is housed in the library's Social Science Division.

Microcard Editions Will Produce Encyclopedic Dictionary—If demand is sufficient, the *Diccionario Enciclopedia Hispano-Americano de Literatura, Ciencias y Artes* is to be reprinted on 4- by 6-inch microfiche sheets. The 28-volume *Diccionario*, originally published in Barcelona between 1887 and 1900, is priced at \$399.00 and contains a wealth of information on all aspects of Latin America, with emphasis placed on the nineteenth century. Oliveira Lima Library Celebrates Centennial—The center of Luso-Brazilian studies at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C., celebrated the centennial of the birth of its founder, Manoel de Oliveira Lima (1867–

1928) during December 1967. An exhibit featuring articles relating to the life of the Brazilian historian, journalist, and diplomat and to the life of the library were featured. The Oliveira Lima library, a collection of 50,000 printed items, occupies a suite of rooms in the John K. Mullen of Denver Library at the university.

University of Southern Mississippi Purchases Private Library—The private library of Arthur P. Whitaker was purchased in early 1968 by the University of Southern Mississippi, Hattiesburg. The collection consists of some 2,365 volumes, most of which are devoted to Latin America and U. S.-Latin American relations. Purchase of the library of the former University of Pennsylvania scholar is but one of the activities of the growing undergraduate Latin American studies program at the University of Southern Mississippi.

Texas Universities Will Microfilm Mexican Archives—At the February 1968 meeting of the Southwest Council on Latin American Studies, a Microfilm Project Committee was appointed to formulate plans for a consortium of Texas universities to microfilm Mexican archival resources. The organization of the consortium would be such that each participating institution would assume responsibility for purchasing microfilms of a specific Mexican state, region or locality, prepare indexes or calendars of the contents of the microfilm holdings, and make copies available to other members of the consortium. The microfilms themselves would be available to consortium members on an inter-library loan basis. This plan would permit a concentration of resources in areas of particular interest for each university, without sacrificing the advantages of a broader acquisition program through cooperation with the other institutions. It was agreed that one of the Texas universities would participate in the Mexico on Microfilm project organized by the State University of New York at Stony Brook (see LARR III:2, p. 165 and 200), so that the archival resources of Guadalajara would be readily accessible. Arrangements for the Texas consortium were to be discussed in detail at the April 5 meeting of the Texas Library Association.

Bibliography on Squatter Settlements Being Prepared—Published and unpublished materials on Latin American squatter settlements, amounting to about 1000 items in April 1968, are included in a bibliography being collated by Elizabeth and Anthony Leeds, Department of Anthropology, University of Texas, Austin 78712. Items include monographs, reports, social work theses for conclusion of course, surveys, records of squatment associations, articles, novels, newspaper articles, and so forth. Each item, programmed for IBM recovery, includes author, title, publication in which found, place and date of publication, publisher, and for unpublished works, place of writing and

responsible institution. Wherever possible, the location where the item is available and in what form the item may be found (xeroxed, microfilmed) are included. Each item is also located by country, city, and squatment if relevant, and its major topical content identified. The author expects that, with assistance from colleagues who may contribute new titles, the indicated type of information or copies of items in the sociology of squatments—as opposed to documents dealing with planning or housing, narrowly conceived with little sociological content—the bibliography can be made available in the near future. AID Begins New Grants Program for Overseas Population Research

The U. S. Agency for International Development announced in early 1968 a limited Institutional Grants Program for family planning and population research. A document containing policy criteria and procedures of the new grants program is to be available from AID; essentially, the present guidelines of the infant program call for a limitation to \$10 million per fiscal year, to be used for grants to research and educational institutions in the United States for the purpose of strengthening their capacity to develop and carry out programs concerned with the economic and social progress of less developed countries. Two grants have already been made: \$1 million to the Carolina Population Center, University of North Carolina, for a two-year period of expansion of research facilities, and \$400,000 to the Johns Hopkins Population Unit, Johns Hopkins University, for research over two years on effective administration of family planning programs.
