J. E. Yates

Mr Yates challenges the traditional view that the promised Spirit-baptism first took place in the Pentecostal outpouring. He argues that Mark and Q preserve an earlier understanding than Acts, according to which the baptism with Holy Spirit was fulfilled during the ministry of Jesus. Whilst dealing primarily with the exegesis of specific texts, it raises issues in the wider field of Christian doctrine—not least the vexed question of the relation of the Spirit to Christ, the Church, and the Sacraments. 30s. net.
