##### THE 1983-84 FULBRIGHT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME WITH AFRICA

Applications are invited for two programs in Sub-Saharan Africa for  
US scholars:

- A. AFRICA RESEARCH - Eight grants are offered for research in any  
any field, in most countries, for periods from three to nine  
months, and are tenable in one or more countries. Evidence of  
of interest in the proposed project from colleagues abroad  
is important. Deadline for submission of applications:  
September 15, 1982. Contact Suzanne McLaughlin for more  
details.
- B. AFRICA REGIONAL LECTURER PROGRAM - Approximately fifty  
lectureships are available at African universities in more  
than twenty countries. Grants are tenable in one country  
only. The Council will accept applications in all fields,  
although, as you will note in the announcement, many  
countries have specified the fields in which they prefer  
candidates. Closing date: September 15, 1982. For details,

We also want to alert you to the visiting scholar portion of the Fulbright  
Program:

- A. GRANTS FOR SENIOR AFRICAN SCHOLARS FOR RESEARCH IN THE US -  
Approximately 45 grants of four-month duration will be  
available for research at US institutions. CIES arranges  
academic affiliations, but scholars must make application  
through the US Embassy in their home countries. Public or  
Cultural Affairs Officers can provide the necessary forms  
and details. Closing date: September 15, 1982.
- B. 1983-84 DIRECTORY OF VISITING FULBRIGHT SCHOLARS and its  
companion-piece, the OCCASIONAL LECTURER PROGRAM, will be  
published by CIES in October. Many of the scholars listed  
in the booklets are available for occasional lectures,  
workshops or seminars and can enhance on-going programs or  
assist in the expansion or development of new ones. A  
separate listing of African grantees only will be compiled
