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Front Cover: Using camera traps deployed in the Northwest Panay Peninsula Natural Park in the Philippines, species distribution modelling showed that the Critically Endangered Negros Bleeding-heart *Gallicolumba keayi* has a preference for dense understorey vegetation and dense canopy. In this issue, the authors show that the Northwest Panay Peninsula Natural Park is currently the most suitable protected area but other areas such as the Mt Kanla-on Natural Park on Negros may contain suitable habitat and further protection of the North Negros Natural Park's eastern border is required. Although law enforcement in remote areas entails logistical and security challenges, it is essential that laws against deforestation and hunting in all remaining population refuges are strictly enforced in order to halt the decline in numbers.
