ERRATUM: "The Anthropologist in West Africa Today" by Phillips Stevens, Jr. in the September 1972 issue of the Review contains an error which should be noted and corrected. The second sentence of the second paragraph on page 258 should read, "Thus, the Bachama village of Kadamon is located in Bata District and its inhabitants are called 'Bata' by others." In the article, "Mbula" appears instead of "Bata." The textual error results from a map error: on the map Kadamon should have been placed just south of the Mbula-Bata boundary. Professor Stevens is grateful to Mr. Nicholas Pweddon, Principal of the Numan (Nigeria) Training College, now at the Department of African Languages and Literature, University of Wisconsin at Madison, for calling this error to his attention.
