Emphasis is laid throughout on the fact that the Church is a Eucharistic fellowship in which its members are all subject to one another in the mutual service of love. This exposition is highly provocative but may help to reconcile many differences.

Qumran Cave 1

After the Dead Sea Scrolls had been discovered in a cave on Jordanian territory in 1947, a thorough search was instituted in the original cave, the ancient settlement of Qumran nearby, and several other caves in the district. Richly rewarding discoveries were made, and it is hoped to publish all the finds in a series of volumes of which this is the first. It contains a description of the contents of the first Qumran Cave, consisting mostly of fragments of the original scrolls, which throw new light on the history of the Old Testament text and on religious trends in Palestine during the first centuries B.C. and A.D. *Illustrated. 63s. net.*
