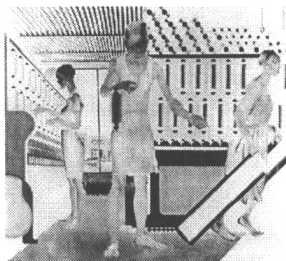

This microfilm collection consists of 354 books and pamphlets in the Russian language, from the Vilna and Elias Tcherikower collections in the YIVO Institute Library, New York. It includes some very rare, unusual and ephemeral books, pamphlets and offprints. Most of these publications were printed in Central and Eastern Europe during the 19th and 20th centuries (all of them before 1940, and most before 1917). They deal with such topics as Jewish religious traditions, Jewish history, the struggle for equal rights in Tsarist Russia, social and political movements, Jewish community organizations, intergroup relations in Russia and Poland, anti-Semitism, and emigration to America.

Accepted manuscripts will be copyedited electronically, and authors will be asked to submit final versions on computer diskette. Submissions will not be returned.

Manuscripts are sent to outside readers in anonymous form and should be prepared accordingly.

The *Slavic Review* does not ordinarily accept unsolicited book reviews. Please consult us in advance of submitting an uninvited book review.
