

National Unity Prize

NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY PRESS AND THE PROGRAM OF AFRICAN STUDIES OF NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY have the honor to announce an annual prize of \$1,000 for an outstanding book which contributes significantly to an understanding of national unity. The manuscript must provide new insights into factors and forces that aid or impair the cohesion of communities--local, regional, national, or international--although its theme and focus need not be explicitly so stated. The manuscript will be published by the Press, and the cash prize will not constitute an advance against royalties.

The manuscript may be from any discipline, or it may be interdisciplinary, but it must be a work of non-fiction; it must be written as a book, as opposed to a collection of papers or reports, and its substantive content should be primarily--though not necessarily exclusively--concerned with African data. It may be a work of single or joint authorship, and the author or authors may be from any country.

Before submitting a manuscript to Northwestern University Press, the author or authors should provide a précis of its content, a statement of why the manuscript is considered eligible for the prize, and a curriculum vitae. The manuscript should not be sent until consideration has been given to this material and a formal request made for it. For 1969 this material should be submitted between January 1 and June 30.

Relevant specialists will be consulted at appropriate stages. The committee that will make the final decision on the award will be made up of the Director of Northwestern University Press, the Director or Associate Director of the Program of African Studies, and the President of the African Studies Association. If a suitable manuscript is received, the announcement of the prize will be made at the annual meeting of the African Studies Association.
