The Classical Association has a worldwide membership and is open to all who value the study of the languages, literature, and civilizations of ancient Greece and Rome. It creates opportunities for friendly exchange and co-operation among classicists, encourages scholarship through its journals and other publications, and supports classics in schools and universities. Every year it holds an annual conference, and it sponsors branches all over the country which put on programmes of lectures and other activities.

The Classical Association has about 3,500 members. Members receive the *Presidential Address* once a year and a newsletter, *CA News*, twice a year. They may also subscribe at substantially reduced cost to the Classical Association journals *Classical Quarterly*, *Classical Review*, and *Greece & Rome*.

GREECE AND ROME EDITORIAL POLICY

The purpose of *Greece and Rome* is to publish scholarly but not technical articles that will be of use to all those who are interested in Classical Civilization, whether or not they are professionally engaged in its study, whether or not they can read Greek or Latin. The editors are particularly eager to report original discoveries in literary criticism, social and economic history, archaeology and art history, and the development of ideas. Illustrated articles are especially welcome. Some two hundred recently published books are reviewed annually.

NEW SURVEYS

A subscription to *Greece & Rome* includes a supplement from the New Surveys in the Classics series. These supplements have covered a broad range of topics, from key figures like Homer and Virgil, to subjects such as Greek tragedy, thought and science, women, slavery, and Roman religion. Selected back volumes can be purchased as books from Cambridge University Press.
