Thomas E. Mann Appointed Association's Executive Director

Thomas E. Mann, Assistant Director of the American Political Science Association and Co-Director of the Congress Project at the American Enterprise Institute, has been appointed by the Council to succeed Evron M. Kirkpatrick as the Association's Executive Director in July 1981. Dr. Mann was nominated for the position at the recent Council meeting by the Association's President, Warren E. Miller, who noted that "Dr. Mann had the support of the Search Committee based upon his outstanding intellectual, professional and personal qualifications.

Dr. Mann is a graduate of the University of Florida and holds a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. His research interests include congressional elections, legislative behavior, and the politics of the presidential nominating system. He is the author of *Unsafe at Any Margin: Interpreting Congressional Elections* and numerous articles and papers. A former APSA Congressional Fellow, he has served as APSA

Assistant Director and Director of the Congressional Fellowship Program since 1970, although since March 1979 he has been half-time visiting fellow at the American Enterprise Institute. Dr. Mann has taught at a number of universities, including most recently the University of Virginia. He is married to a fellow political scientist, Sheilah Mann, and has two children, Teddy and Stephanie.
