E. P. SANDERS

The synoptic gospels contain traditions about Jesus which differ in some respects from gospel to gospel, and, scholars believe, from the very earliest Christian traditions, and the methods and criteria they use are of the greatest importance. Dr Sanders has reassessed the whole problem, comparing the textual and literary traditions and calling into question many assumptions which have influenced New Testament criticism. *9os. net*
