1. The submission is an original, unpublished work which is not being submitted for publication elsewhere.
2. It should not exceed 25 printed I.C.L.Q. pages. State the number of words used.
3. The manuscript must be typed, double-spaced, on one side only of a uniform sized paper. *It is most important that footnotes be double-spaced.*
4. Footnotes must be numbered consecutively through the article and typed as a separate section at the end of the manuscript.
5. A submission of less than 6,000 words may be considered for the "Shorter Articles, Comments and Notes" section, which may secure earlier publication.

Authors are asked to refer to past issues of the I.C.L.Q. for style. More detailed guidance will be sent on request.
