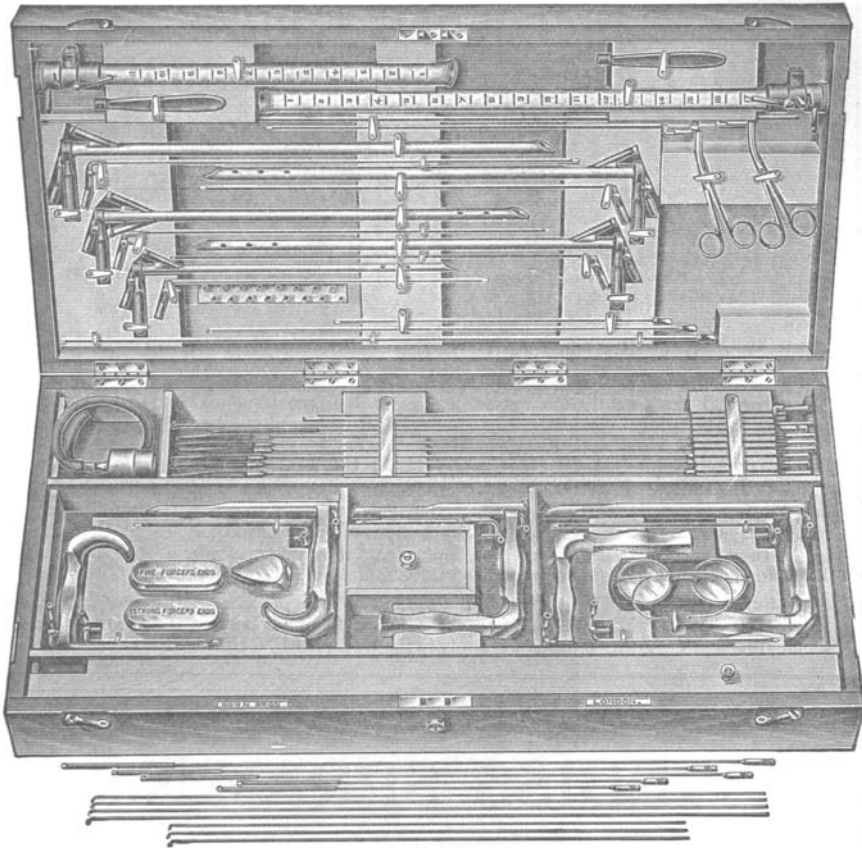

Minor operations are performed in the Out-patient Department by the Assistant Surgeons on three mornings a week.

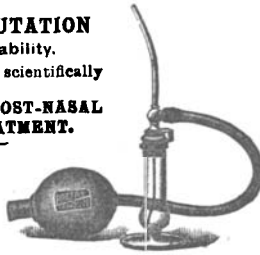
