### THE "CHRISTIANS FOR CHRISTIANS" INSCRIPTIONS OF PHRYGIA

The people of Phrygia in Asia Minor produced a rich crop of epigraphic monuments in the third century A.D. This monograph is a collection and study of epitaphs containing the formula, "Christians for Christians," which are often attributed to the Montanist movement. Other interesting monuments not of this type but from the same area are included, in order to recreate the milieu in which the "Christians for Christians" epitaphs were set up.

The work includes a full presentation, including translation, of the inscriptions, a brief history of the Montanist movement, a discussion of the attribution of the inscriptions to Montanists, and full indices with maps and plates.
