THE PARISISTAS OF THE ATHARVAVEDA. Ed. by G. M. BOLLING and J. v. NEGELEIN. Vol. I: Text and critical apparatus.— Part I: Parisistas i—xxxvi; Part II: Parisistas xxxvii—lxxvii. 1909. 8vo. pp. 534. M. 26.

The Atharvapisistas, which form one of the most important works on the religious history and culture of mediæval India, will now be edited for the first time in their whole extent. This first complete edition will comprise three volumes of about 600 pages each. The first volume will contain the transcription, to be published in three parts, issued at short intervals. The second and third volumes will contain a translation of the Parisistas, an exegetical commentary, a number of unpublished texts, that throw light upon the subject-matter of the Parisistas, and will deal with the many grammatical and lexicographical peculiarities which the texts present. The preparation of these volumes is already well advanced, and their appearance will not be long delayed. It is evident that this standard work will prove indispensable equally to linguists and students in Indian archæology, mythology, and Hindu religion.

SPOER, H. H. and E. NASRALLAH HADDAD. Manual of Palestinian Arabic. 1909. Large 8vo. pp. xii, 226. M. 6.50.

This book is devoted to practical purposes, and will certainly be of great use in daily life. It contains an English-Arabic vocabulary, a collection of idioms, stories, rhymes, and proverbs, which will be of interest to students.

AL-MAKRIZI. Kitab itti'az al-hunafa bi ahbar al-a'imma al-hulafa. Edited for the first time according to the Autograph-Unicode of Gotha, by H. BUNZ. 8vo. pp. viii, 151, with 1 facs. M. 5.

Contains the history of the first four Caliphs of the Fatimide dynasty.

NESTORIUS. Le livre d'Héraclide de Damas. Texte syriaque publ. avec plusieurs appendices p. P. BEDJAN. 1910. 8vo. M. 22.50.

First edition of this famous text of Nestorius, Patriarch of Constantinople, who was one of the most important figures in the history of the ecclesiastical controversies of his time, and was suspended at Ephesus A.D. 431.

AHMAD IBN ABÍ TAHIR TAIFUR. Kitāb Bagdad. Vol. VI. Edited and translated by Dr. H. KELLER. 2 parts. Arabic text (lithogr.) and German translation. 4to. £1.

The only fragment existing of a famous historical work dating from the Third Century of the Hegira, which deals to a large extent with the reign of *al-Mamun*, the son and successor of Harun-al-Rashid. It contains valuable material for the historian as well as for the Arabist. A learned introduction by Dr. Keller gives useful hints for the study of the history of the *Abbasides*, and shows what were the sources of *Taifur* and the great Arabic historian *Tabari*.

The Pahlavi is re-edited from the Journal of the German Oriental Society with all the MSS. collated, Bd. lvii, Heft iv, 1903; the English translation is re-edited from the Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society for October, 1904; Nēryosangh's Sanskrit is re-edited from Spiegel with the additional collation of five MSS., and for the first time translated. The Persian is from the Munich MSS. already partly edited in the Gāthas. An Appendix contains the accented Sanskrit Equivalents of the Avesta Text by the Author, issued upon the plan adopted by him with Yasna xxviii in Roth's *Festgruss*, 1893 (Oldenburg compared the Vedic poetry, in Vedic Religion, p. 27), and with Yasna XLIV in the Acts of the Eleventh Congress of Orientalists held in Paris, 1897. Four photographic plates of MSS., with other illustrative matter, are added, pp. 163, to be had of F. A. BROCKHAUS, in Leipzig, 10s. 6d.; Yasna I is especially valuable as it deals with the chief important questions of all the non-Gāthic Yasna. Also a Dictionary of the Gāthic Language of the Zend Avesta, being vol. iii of the Gāthas, pp. 623-821, Leipzig, 1903, price 12s. 6d., with 160 additional pages soon ready, pp. 622 + 360, Gāthas 982 + xvii, 1910. £1.
