Authors submit manuscripts to the editor for consideration as ARTICLES, REPORTS, COMMENTS, or FORUM essays. REVIEWS and BOOK NOTES are solicited by the respective associate editor. OBITUARIES should be submitted to the editor, *The SAA Archaeological Record*, for publication (see *SAA Bulletin* March/April 1996, p. 7, for further details).

Authors are required to submit manuscripts electronically through Editorial Manager® (<http://www.editorialmanager/aq>). Detailed information on policy, style, and technical matters of manuscript preparation is given in the “Editorial Policy, Information for Authors, and Style Guide for *American Antiquity*, *Latin American Antiquity*, and *Advances in Archaeological Practice*,” which can be accessed at <http://www.saa.org/AbouttheSociety/Publications/StyleGuide/tbid/984/Default.aspx>.
