Pictures, 2004 by Mati Garcia-Monzon (b. 1944)

Mati Garcia-Monzon was born in Spain and started painting during her childhood in Cadiz. Her CV includes national and international exhibitions, and also illustrations in books and magazines. In 2004 a relative of Mati had a stroke and since then she spends time caring for her. During the first year after the stroke, Mati drew a number of pictures related to this experience. They show a deconstructed reality where some elements are missing and others have changed their shape or size. Despite the abstracted forms there is strong sense of shared physicality. Is this the reality of life after stroke as seen through the eyes of a carer?
