The book points to the layered influences that railroads have exerted on the formation of America's industrial nation, and how these changes have affected the fabric of society. By the end of the nineteenth century, as the author points out, the steam railroad had participated in transforming the United States from a rural agrarian republic into a continental industrial nation.
