THE CONTRIBUTORS

Felix Gilbert is Professor of History at Bryn Mawr College. He was formerly a member of the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, and during the war served in the Research and Analysis Branch of the Office of Strategic Services both in Washington and abroad. His most recent book is Hitler Directs His War: The Secret Records of His Daily Military Conferences.

Arnold Wolfers is Sterling Professor of International Relations at Yale University. He has taught on the faculty of the School of Military Government in Charlottesville, Va., and of the National War College in Washington, D.C. He is an advisory editor of World Politics.

Mario Einaudi has been Professor of Government at Cornell University since 1945, and is co-author of the forthcoming book, Communism in Western Europe. This volume is the first of a projected series devoted to the study of the contemporary economic, political, and constitutional problems of France and Italy.

Raymond L. Garthoff is currently on the staff of the Social Science Division of The RAND Corporation as a specialist on Russian and Soviet affairs. He has contributed several articles to World Politics.

Paul E. Zinner is a graduate fellow at the Russian Research Center, Harvard University, engaged at present in writing his doctoral dissertation.

Daniel Lerner is Professor of Sociology and Director of Research in The Hoover Institute at Stanford University. During the past academic year he has been Visiting Professor of Sociology at Columbia University. His recent books include Sykewar: Psychological Warfare Against Germany, Propaganda in War and Crisis (with Harold D. Lasswell), and The Policy Sciences.
