**THE FORMATIVE YEARS OF THE MISSIONARY COLLEGE
OF SANTA CRUZ OF QUERETARO, 1683-1733**

By **MICHAEL B. McCLOSKEY, O.F.M., Ph.D.**

Although widely known for its part in the development of the southwestern part of the United States, the great and far-reaching influence of the Missionary College of Santa Cruz of Querétaro on the other parts of the hemisphere is comparatively unknown. The first of a series of similar institutions, the College of Querétaro sent missionaries by the score to the northern frontiers of New Spain and to the south as far as Peru. Its methods and organization became a model and pattern for the eighteen mission colleges that were founded from Querétaro throughout Spanish America.

The author skilfully traces the beginnings and progress of this pioneer missionary experiment. Basing his work on the best primary sources and his own archival research, he recounts, step by step, the long and difficult paths that the missionaries trod. Anyone interested in the history of the missions and mission methods will find this an invaluable account.
