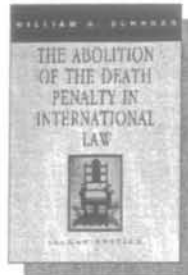
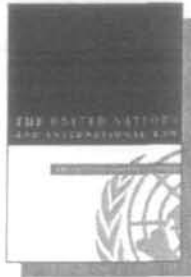

The 50th Anniversary of the International Law Commission has focused attention on the question of what the ILC has achieved, and which topics it should address in the coming decades. This volume provides a thought-provoking response to these questions, containing *The Report of the Study Group on the Future Work of the International Law Commission* prepared by an independent study group, jointly chaired by Professor Alan Boyle of Edinburgh University and Dr. Vaughan Lowe of Cambridge University. The *Report* identifies a number of topics suitable for immediate treatment by the International Law Commission and further argues that the ILC should adopt a more progressive role in the international law-making process.
