### SOVIET NATIONAL INCOME AND PRODUCT IN 1928

OLEG HOEFFDING. Following the methodology evolved by Bergson—with some major modifications introduced to take account of the existence of a significant "private sector" and other historical features—Dr. Hoeffding closely examines the Soviet economy in 1928. The Soviet Union had at that time regained the physical output levels of Russia just before the outbreak of World War I. At that time, too, the changes later generated by forced industrialization and collectivization of agriculture were imminent but had not yet set in. This book, then, studies Soviet national income at a crucial point in Soviet development. Added significance is given through the comparisons made with official Soviet income statistics and with Bergson's findings for 1937. **\$3.75**

### SOVIET NATIONAL INCOME AND PRODUCT 1940-48

ABRAM BERGSON and HANS HEYMANN, JR. Analyzing the Soviet economy during a relatively advanced phase of comprehensive planning, this book gives a detailed picture of Soviet finance and resource allocation policy under conditions of mobilization, war, and reconstruction. Comparisons are made with 1937. Accounts for 1940, 1944, and 1948 are compiled in terms of prevailing prices and revalued in terms of adjusted factor cost. **T**HE unique Milman Parry collection of Yugoslav heroic songs has long been well known to scholars of epic poetry, but largely by reputation only. Now, for the first time, material from this monumental collection is available in print—exactly as it is still sung in Yugoslavia. These two volumes inaugurate the presentation of the full collection, and include the songs of five Novi Pazar singers, together with conversations with the singers, both in English translation (Volume I) and in the original (Volume II). Volume I also includes prefaces by John H. Finley, Roman Jakobson, and the editor; synopses of additional songs; photographs of the singers; ample notes; and a musical transcription of one of the songs as recorded by the late Béla Bartók, with his notes thereon. Published jointly with the Serbian Academy of Sciences, Belgrade, these books present a remarkable living epic tradition as completely as modern scholarship is able to do.
