MICHAEL BOLLIG works on the Arid Climate, Adaptation and Cultural Innovation in Africa (ACACIA) research programme at the Institut für Völkerkunde at the University of Cologne. During fieldwork among the pastoral Pokot (East Africa) in 1987–93 and 1994–7 among the pastoral Himba (Namibia) he concentrated on hazards to pastoral livelihoods and the strategies of risk management.

RICHARD FANTHORPE completed his doctoral thesis on the Biriwa Limba chiefdom in northern Sierra Leone for University College London in 1994. He has published an article on Limba 'deep rural' strategies in the Journal of African History.

MICHAEL LAMBERT teaches African studies at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. In addition he worked for two years in southern Mauritania on an agricultural development project.
