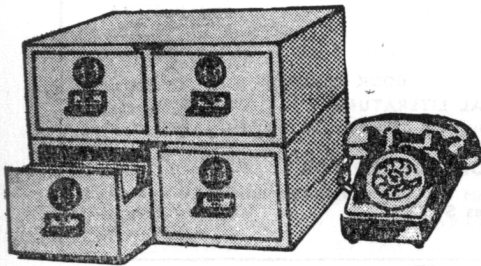

Strategy in the Missile Age

By *BERNARD BRODIE*

A balanced analysis of the requirements of strategy in the era of thermonuclear weapons and intercontinental missiles which addresses itself to basic concepts as well as to the present situation of the U.S. and its allies. Dr. Brodie takes full account of earlier strategic concepts from Clausewitz to Douhet, but because he believes that many outdated military ideas live with us in subtle and dangerous ways, he departs radically from earlier strategic thinkers. Yet his book does not defend any program or constitute a brief for any one of the armed services. It offers a sound basis for strategy in the 1960's and explores such important topics as the significance of Soviet achievements in missiles as compared with our own, the probable future of NATO, Soviet plans, our SAC and our general military posture.
