These works have inspired several generations of students of Indian religion and culture. Drawing on interviews and archival research conducted during two years of fieldwork in India and Nepal, including the study of more than forty previously unnoticed works by women of the Pāla period (eighth through twelfth centuries C.E.), she substantially reinterprets the history of Tantric Buddhism during its first four centuries.

Article manuscripts, including notes, should not exceed 40 pages in length. Please submit four copies. All submitted work should be double-spaced, including extracts, notes, and references.
