THE OWL OF MINERVA: CALL FOR PAPERS

The Owl of Minerva will publish a special issue honouring Henry S Harris, on the occasion of his new two-volume study of Hegel's *Phenomenology* entitled *Hegel's Ladder* (Hackett Publishing Co, September 1997).

Papers submitted for consideration must be substantial essays, not book reviews. Priority consideration will be given to those that focus on *Hegel's Ladder* and engage it on significant issues. Papers that discuss Prof Harris' other works, if these discussions are directly relevant to the positions developed in *Hegel's Ladder*, will also be considered. Submissions are limited to fourty double-spaced pages; and *The Owl* reserves the right to ask for a shorter version if we judge that this will improve the paper itself or the issue as a whole. Submissions will be judged by a committee selected from *The Owl*'s editorial staff, Editorial Advisory Board and Board of Consultants.
