Notes on the Ethnography and Precolonial History of the Bamenda Grassfields, West Cameroon (1966)

MIMEOGRAPHED notes by Mrs. E. M. Chilver and Dr. P. Kaberry, based on field-work carried out during several visits to West Cameroon, have been prepared for use by educational institutions in West Cameroon.

Language distributions, economy, and material culture are briefly surveyed. Traditions of migration, settlement, and state-formation are dealt with in some detail, together with the social and political institutions of selected chiefdoms. The appendixes include bibliographical notes, a gazetteer of principal chiefdoms, and numerals 1-10 in thirty-one languages and dialects spoken in the area. Copies have been deposited for consultation at some centres of African studies in West Africa, Great Britain, Europe, and the United States to make them more generally available to scholars.
