Sisters and Strangers

Women in the Shanghai Cotton Mills, 1919-1949

Emily Honig. The majority of cotton mill workers in China's largest industrial center prior to 1949 were women, and this book is one of the first to examine their historical experience. The author shows why women in Shanghai rarely participated in the radical labor movement of the 1920's, and traces their gradual politicization in the next two decades to the point that a strike against mill owners in 1948 was led primarily by women. We are also given rich information on women's daily lives both inside and outside the mills, and on the kinds of social relationships they formed with other women to exercise some degree of control over their lives. \$37.50

Gail Hershatter. Until now the history of the Chinese working class has been covered primarily through accounts of union formation and strikes. This new book creates a history of working people in Tianjin (Tientsin) based on an urban history of the modern city and on vivid case studies of workers in three different sectors—ironworking, transport, and textile manufacture. The author focuses on the uneven physical growth and capitalist development of the city, on working-class culture and consciousness, and on the role workers played in shaping Tianjin's identity as a major port city. 


