A CRETAN STATUETTE IN THE FITZWILLIAM MUSEUM. A Study in Minoan Costume. By A. J. B. WACE. With 13 plates

The Cretan Statuette which was recently acquired for the Fitzwilliam Museum belongs to the Bronze Age and probably to the sixteenth century B.C. Mr. Wace discusses its provenance and technique and its date, subject, and style, and describes the costume in the light of the textile materials known to have been available in Crete in the Bronze Age, and compares it with analogous illustrations of Minoan dress. The book is illustrated both in colour and in monochrome.
