WENCKSTERN, Fr. v. Bibliography of the Japanese Empire. Being a classified list of all books, essays, and maps in European languages relating to Dai Nihon (Great Japan), published in Europe, America, and in the East 1859-93 A.D. To which is added a facsimile reprint of L. PAGÈS' *Bibliographie japonaise depuis le XV^e s. jusqu'à 1859.* Vol. I. Reprint, 1910. Large 8vo. M. 25.

This first volume of the important and excellent bibliography, which was published for the first time in 1895, has been out of print for several years. The new edition, carefully produced by the best chemotype process, now enables me to furnish the complete work, the second volume of which appeared at the same price in 1907; I also deliver this volume. To those, especially, who possess the second volume, and who were not able to acquire the first one, the chemotype reprint will be very welcome.

GLEYE, A. Hittite Studies. Part I. 1910. Large 8vo. In German. M. 20.

In the above part the author has not followed the usual manner of deciphering the hieroglyphic characters of the Hittite Inscriptions, but has adopted an altogether new method, as a result of which he seems to have found a solution of the keenly discussed problem of the peoples of Asia Minor, which will be of the greatest interest to all scholars of comparative linguistic studies.

THE PARISISTAS OF THE ATHARVAVEDA. Ed. by G. M. BOLLING and J. v. NEGELEIN. Vol. I: Text and critical apparatus. Parts I and II, Parisistas i-lxxii; Part III, Indices. 1909-10. Lex. 8vo. M. 40.

This most important work will comprise three volumes of about 600 pages; the first volume, containing the transcription, is now complete. The second and third volumes will contain a translation of the Parisistas, an exegetical commentary, a number of unpublished texts, which throw light upon the subject-matter of the Parisistas, a very accurate translation, and a systematic description of particular subjects.

n continuous treatment, upon the plan initiated in the FIVE ZARATHUSHTRIAN GĀTHAS, by L. H. MILLS, Professor of Zend (Avesta) Philology in the University of Oxford, A STUDY OF YASNA I, with the Avesta, Pahlavi, Sanskrit, and Persian Texts. The Pahlavi is given in the original character and in transliteration, the Pahlavi and Sanskrit being translated into English here, the Avesta in S. B. E., xxxi, 1887, with Sanskrit Equivalents here, 1910; the Persian is itself an interlinear translation of the Pahlavi. The Avesta Text is reconstructural with copious notes. The Pahlavi is re-edited from the Journal of the German Oriental Society, with all the MSS. collated, Bd. lviii, Heft iv, 1903; the English translation is re-edited from the Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society for October, 1904; Nēryosangh's Sanskrit is re-edited from Spiegel, with the additional collation of five MSS., and for the first time translated. The Persian is from the Munich MSS. already partly edited in the Gāthas. An Appendix contains the accented Sanskrit Equivalents of the Avesta Text by the Author, issued upon the plan adopted by him with Yasna xxviii in Roth's *Festgruss*, 1893 (Oldenburg compared the Vedic poetry, in Vedic Religion, p. 27), and with Yasna XLIV in the Acts of the Eleventh Congress of Orientalists held in Paris, 1897. Four photographic plates of MSS., with other illustrative matter, are added, pp. 163, to be had of F. A. BROCKHAUS, in Leipzig, 10s. 6d.; Yasna I is especially valuable as it deals with the chief important questions of all the non-Gāthic Yasna. Also a Dictionary of the Gāthic Language of the Zend Avesta, being vol. iii of the Gāthas, pp. 623-821, Leipzig, 1903, price 12s. 6d., with 200 additional pages soon ready, pp. 622+400, Gāthas 1022+xlvii, 1910. £1.
