DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD NOMINATIONS SOLICITED

The Distinguished Service Award, established by the Society for American Archaeology, is presented annually to a member for specific accomplishments of extraordinary quality. Recognition can be granted in a wide range of areas relating to archaeology, including, for example, teaching (academic as well as public education), research (theory, method, application of new technology, analysis, etc.), and conservation of archaeological data (curatorial, legal, managerial), as long as two basic criteria are met. First, the contribution must be truly extraordinary in nature (not expected in the normal course of events) and must be recognized widely as such, and second, it must be of a positive and lasting quality.

The Society is accepting nominations from members for the 1992 award, which will be presented at the annual meeting in April 1992, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Each recommendation should be supported by a statement documenting concisely and thoroughly the achievements of the nominee. The deadline for nominations is **December 1, 1991**.
