EDITORIAL POLICY

Language in Society is concerned with all branches of the study of speech and language as aspects of social life. Preference is given to contributions of general theoretical or methodological interest. Contributions may vary from predominantly linguistic to predominantly social in content, but are expected to involve both poles of the journal's field of concern in some explicit way. The journal seeks to aid in

strengthening international scholarship and cooperation in this field, and from time to time will carry a set of articles reflecting the state and interest of sociolinguistic research in a specific country or region. In addition to original articles, the journal publishes reviews of current books, brief accounts of work in progress, and notes and comments on points arising out of recent publications.
