PAINTING IN ISLAM. A Study of the Place of Pictorial Art in Muslim Culture. By Sir THOMAS ARNOLD. Demy 4to, with 65 plates (8 in colour). 84s. net.

The present work makes no claim to be a history of Muslim painters, either of Persia or of any other country, though a chapter has been added, giving from hitherto untranslated historical sources the scanty materials available for the biographies of the most famous Persian painters. The purpose of the book is rather to indicate the place of painting in the culture of the Islamic world, both in relation to those theological circles which condemned the practice of it, and to those persons who, disregarding the prohibitions of religion, consulted their own tastes in encouraging it. A chapter on landscape has purposely been omitted, since it was recognized that an adequate account of this aspect of the subject would require a separate treatise.—From the Preface.

THE GODS OF NORTHERN BUDDHISM: their History, Iconography, and Progressive Evolution through the Northern Buddhist Countries. By ALICE GETTY. With a General Introduction on Buddhism translated from the French of J. DENIKER and illustrations from the Collection of HENRY H. GETTY. Second Edition. 4to, with a frontispiece and 57 plates (8 in colour). 105s. net. Miss Getty's book was first published in 1914. Since then fresh discoveries have been made, and both text and plates have been very considerably revised for the new edition.

GREEK VASES IN POLAND. By J. D. BEAZLEY. 4to, with 32 collotype plates. 42s. net.

CATALOGUE OF A LOAN EXHIBITION OF SILVER PLATE belonging to the Colleges of the University of Oxford. Crown 4to, with 73 illustrations. 105. 6d. net.

The exhibition was suggested by the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths, which by prizes for original work, and by travelling scholarships, has done so much in recent years to regenerate English silver-craft; in the hope that an opportunity for the study of so varied a series of examples, covering so many periods and styles, would be valued by the designer and craftsman, as well as by students and the custodians of public and private collections. The exhibition may claim to be an exceptionally complete illustration of the history of the silversmiths' craft in England from medieval times.

R O M A N LONDON

NEW volume devoted entirely to Roman London has now been added to the increasingly popular series of Inventories by the Royal Commission on Historical Monuments. The. book will be of fascinating interest since the extent and variety of Roman remains are probably unsuspected by the millions who know the London of to-day. Now for the first time it is possible to see in a single volume reproductions of all that has remained of the Roman city of Londinium. For 'Roman London' contains not only a complete account of all extant memorials of the Roman City but records and illustrates also the results of the excavations made in the past which were covered up as soon as made. COLLINGWOOD, Dr DAVIES PRYCE and Dr G. F. HILL, making it the most complete work which has yet appeared on Roman London.
