THE CONTRIBUTORS

PETER R. GOULD is Professor of Geography at the Pennsylvania State University and currently Visiting Professor at the Geographical Institute, Royal University of Lund. He is conducting research on the mental maps and perception surfaces of Sweden as related to decision and migration processes underlying urbanization. He is the author of *Transport in Ghana* (1960) and *Africa: Continent of Change* (1961), and co-author of *Spatial Organization* (forthcoming, 1970).
