THE NINTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF CHEMOTHERAPY

JULY 13TH TO 18TH, 1975

To be held in London under the patronage of Her Majesty the Queen and the Presidency of Professor W. Brumfitt. Following the inaugural ceremony at the Albert Hall, the scientific sessions will be held at the Imperial College of Science and Technology. Chemotherapy embraces both antimicrobial and anticancer agents, so the special symposia will explore current research and new approaches in the management of infections and cancer—chemotherapy of tuberculosis, life-threatening infections, tropical diseases, antiviral and antifungal chemotherapy, venereal diseases, leukaemia, potentiators of radiotherapy, new anticancer regimes and immunological aspects of anticancer drugs. In addition to international symposia and invited special speakers, there are also sessions for free communications for which participants are invited to make 10 minute presentations followed by 5 minute discussion. The scientific sessions are supported by an outstanding social programme which includes sightseeing tours of London, Greenwich by river, a night out with London's Cockney Pearly Kings and Queens, and of course, trips to Hampton Court, Windsor Castle, Oxford, Blenheim, Chartwell, Knole, St. Paul's and the Tower of London. The Organizing Committee has not overlooked the needs of the impoverished postgraduate who prefers cheap accommodation, for a block booking has been made of London University hostels.
