

WORK AND AUTHORITY IN INDUSTRY

Ideologies of Management in the Course of Industrialization

By REINHARD BENDIX, *University of California, Berkeley*. Investigates those ideologies "which seek to justify the subordination of large masses of men to the discipline of factory work and to the authority of employers." INCOME OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE

By HERMAN P. MILLER, *U.S. Bureau of the Census*. Indicates the relation between the amount of income received by individuals and various social and economic factors such as age, sex, education, geographic location, occupation, marital status, and color. It is based primarily on data obtained in the 1940 and 1950 national censuses and numerous sample surveys of the U.S. population. *One of the Census Monographs, sponsored by the Social Science Research Council*. 1955. 206 pages. \$5.50.

DYNAMIC FACTORS IN INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTIVITY

By SEYMOUR MELMAN, *Columbia University*. The first major attempt to treat the question: What *causes* the observed changes and differences in productivity? In this light, the author defines major conditions that must be satisfied if productivity changes are to be effected. The data presented were derived from detailed investigation of actual operating conditions of manufacturing industry. 1956. 238 pages. \$4.75.
