The CJP Student Essay Contest

The Canadian Journal of Philosophy is pleased to announce the initiation of an annual Student Essay Contest. The contest is open to graduate and undergraduate students at Canadian Universities. The winner's paper, which may be in any area of philosophy and be in either English or French, will be printed in a future issue of the **CJP**. The editors reserve the right not to award a winner in any given year. Entries should normally be between 1000 and 5000 words, although exceptional longer ones will be considered. Entrants should not put their name or university on the manuscript, but rather state in a covering letter that they are a student at a Canadian University and that the paper is for consideration in the Essay Contest. The deadline for the first Essay Contest is May 1st, 1982 and entrants should have been a student in the previous academic year. Papers received after May 1st, 1982 will be considered for the second Essay Contest, if entrant is still a student.
