The editors invite the submission of manuscripts that make original contributions to the understanding of sociolegal processes. *Law & Social Inquiry* considers both empirical analyses and theoretical studies without restriction as to time or place. *Law & Social Inquiry* embraces the broad range of perspectives current in contemporary social science and humanities disciplines.

Law & Social Inquiry is a refereed journal that practices double-blind peer review. Manuscripts deemed appropriate for the journal are evaluated by two or more referees with expertise in the relevant subject matter and methodology. Manuscripts are rendered anonymous prior to review; referees are not identified to authors.

Law & Social Inquiry will not consider any manuscript concurrently submitted for publication elsewhere. Submission of a manuscript commits the author to publish the manuscript in *Law & Social Inquiry* if accepted for publication by the Editors.

Manuscript Preparation and Submission Guidelines: Manuscripts submitted to *Law & Social Inquiry* should be prepared using MSWord or Corel WordPerfect. Please use Times New Roman 12pt font. Article manuscripts should be double-spaced throughout, including footnotes/endnotes. Article manuscripts must be accompanied by an abstract of no more than 150 words. Please provide a title page as a separate document, including all author-identifying and contact information. Article manuscripts in excess of 80 pages (20,000 words) inclusive of notes and citations will be considered only in exceptional circumstances. Accepted Manuscripts: Manuscripts that are accepted for publication must be brought into full conformity with *Law & Social Inquiry* style. Detailed instructions can be found at www.blackwellpublishing.com/LSI and http://www.blackwellpublishing.com/pdf/Manuscript_Guide.pdf.

Accepted manuscripts are copy-edited for style but not substance; authors remain responsible for citation accuracy and for all statements of fact or opinion. Authors are given an opportunity to review edited manuscripts and/or proofs.
