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### ANNOUNCEMENT

A National Registry for Idiopathic Sensorineural Sudden Deafness has been established in the Department of Otolaryngology at the University of Minnesota through a grant from the John A. Hartford Foundation, Inc. The Minnesota Regional Hearing Center will serve as a central repository for reporting of such problem cases in the United States. Because no single physician or clinic sees enough cases of sudden sensorineural deafness to do a significant analysis and study, it is desirable to pool and coordinate the experience of many.

Physicians who participate in this study will be provided with materials which include diagnostic and therapeutic protocols as well as a comprehensive patient questionnaire. These will be continually updated to reflect analysis of the data returned and other developments in this area.
