#### FIRST MEETING OF ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION

The first meeting of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, a 17-member panel whose 10 citizen members were named by President Johnson in March, 1967, held its first meeting on July 20 and 21 at the Department of the Interior in Washington, D.C. The Council also includes Federal Department heads and the Chairman of the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Established by the National Historic Preservation Act of October 15, 1966, which calls for a "program for the preservation of additional historic properties throughout the Nation," the Council will advise the President and Congress on matters pertaining to historic preservation. The National Park Service provides administrative support to the Advisory Council.
