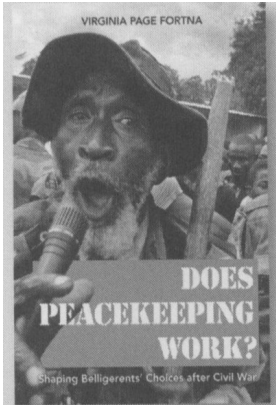

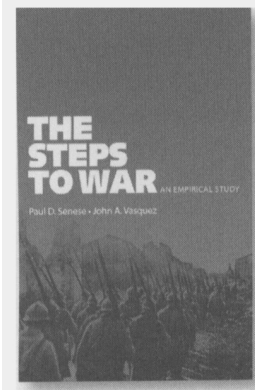

## The Steps to War

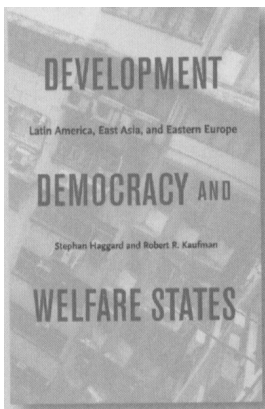
An Empirical Study
