This monumental work is the outcome of some thirty years' labour. The aim of the bibliography is to present as complete a record as possible of hieroglyphic inscriptions. The arrangement is topographical. It is anticipated that the second volume (*Theban Temples*) will be published next year, to be followed by three further volumes; the work will be completed by a comprehensive index.
