REPORT.

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING WAS HELD ON TUESDAY,
6TH NOVEMBER, 1923, AT THE COLLEGE OF PRECEPTORS.

Mr. OLIVER D. BELSHAM in the Chair.

After the Minutes had been read and confirmed, the following Report was read by the Secretary :—

The Council beg to present their Report of the Forty-ninth Session, in the course of which papers have been read : (1) by Miss Caroline Lejeune on "Opera in the Eighteenth Century"; (2) by Sir Frederick Bridge on "Country Cryes," with illustrations by Miss Coral Peachey, Miss Champneys, Mr. H. Thompson and Mr. Graham Smart (vocalists), assisted by students from Trinity College of Music (strings); (3) by Mr. Gustav Holst on "Byrd and Weekes," with illustrations sung by the Morley College Choir; (4) By Dr. Adrian Boult on "The Orchestral Problem of the Future"; (5) by Mr. Arthur Bliss on "Some Aspects of the Present Musical Situation"; and (6) by Mr. A. H. Fox-Strangways on "Translation of Songs," with illustrations by Miss Lucia Young. The Council desire to offer their warmest thanks to the above named lecturers and performers for their valued contributions.

During the Session the meetings have been held by the courtesy of the London Academy of Music at 22 Princes Street, W. Owing to the increased attendance these quarters have proved rather too limited for comfort, and the Council have therefore made arrangements for the meetings to take place at the College of Preceptors in Bloomsbury Square, where there is ample accommodation for the requirements of the Association.

It is gratifying to record that twenty new members have been elected, so that the strength of the Association has been well maintained, the number of members on the roll standing at 232 of all classes on June 30th, 1923. The Council desire to remind members that the Session about to begin will be the fiftieth in the life of the Musical Association. In order to celebrate the occasion, it is proposed to hold a Dinner in January, 1924, as a means of drawing the attention of a larger public to the Musical Association, its aims and its work. The best way of marking the event would be to raise the membership to a height as yet unattained, and thus to increase its power and prestige. Members are earnestly requested to co-operate with the Council in making the Fiftieth Session a memorable one.

It is with regret that the Council record the loss by death of several esteemed members, Dr. A. G. Hill, Rev. J. F. Lord, Mr. Oscar Street, Mr. G. G. T. Treherne and Mr. G. H. Westbury.

The Financial Statement, duly audited, shows a satisfactory balance in hand. During the last few years several Life Subscriptions have been received, and the sum therefrom has now been expended in the purchase of £100 worth of $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ annuities. The total sum now invested stands at the nominal amount of £750.

Mr. John E. West moved the adoption of the Report. This was seconded by Dr. Froggatt and carried unanimously.

The Hon. Treasurer presented the audited Balance Sheet. The Chairman moved that it be passed. This was seconded by Dr. Froggatt and carried unanimously.

No other nominations having been sent in, the Chairman declared that those nominated by the Council were duly elected, and the meeting closed with Votes of Thanks for their services to the Officers, and the Chairman for presiding.

THE FIFTIETH SESSION.

THE PRESIDENT : Before we call upon Mr. Pearson I would like to say one or two words. You have heard in the Minutes that the last Session was the 49th of our existence as an Association which is therefore now entering upon its 50th year. Generally the 50th year is taken to be an appropriate occasion for celebration. We hope, therefore, that during this year the Musical Association will have a happy and fruitful time both in regard to the Papers which will be read and also in regard to the membership.
