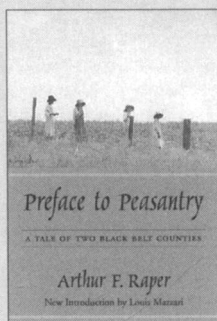


## *SSHA Graduate Student Prize*

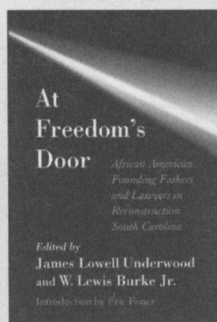
