### JOSEPH D. NORRIS, ESQ. HEALTH LAW FUND

The Joseph D. Norris, Esq. Health Law Fund of the American Society of Law & Medicine is pleased to announce the establishment of the Joseph D. Norris, Esq. Health Law Prize. The Prize will be awarded periodically in recognition of outstanding contributions to the American Journal of Law & Medicine. The Overseers of the Norris Fund will select the winner of the Prize based on the recommendations of the Journal's Student Board of Editors. The Prize includes a plaque and an honorarium of \$1000.

The establishment of this Prize is representative of the continuing commitment that the Joseph D. Norris, Esq. Health Law Fund has demonstrated to furthering education in the health law field. The Fund was created in 1980 and thus far has awarded four health law fellowships for educational activities associated with the JOURNAL. Each fellowship carries a stipend of \$1000 to support a fellow for three weeks' full-time (or its part-time equivalent) for research and educational activities. The Fund intends to award two or more of these fellowships per year.

In addition, the Fund has the following purposes: (1) to solicit charitable contributions for use in financing JOURNAL fellowships and other educational activities specified by the Trustees of the Fund; (2) to finance and support the acquisition of important publications for the Sagall Library of Law, Medicine & Health Care; and (3) to fund such other educational activities related to health law education and research as the Overseers shall deem reasonable.
