OCCUPATIONAL DEAFNESS COURSE
7–9 January 1986

Designed primarily for otolaryngologists and other medical and scientific staff concerned with the investigation and assessment of occupational deafness.

The syllabus will include: basic acoustics and noise measurement; relationships between noise and hearing loss; principles of engineering control of noise; diagnosis of noise-induced hearing loss and non-organic hearing loss; electric response audiometry; monitoring audiometry; hearing protection and noise education; medico-legal aspects of occupational deafness including statutory and common law compensation; rehabilitation of patients with occupational deafness, including hearing aids and environmental aids.

There will be demonstrations and practical sessions to support the lectures on most topics. The course is non-residential; however, a number of single rooms have been reserved at The Albany at a cost of £29.50 per night bed and breakfast.
